It has been my privilege to be the President for another year which sees Manly Vale FC continue to be in a good financial situation with over 1,100 players registered. Our club is one with strong family values and we are really and equally proud of our past, present and future. The small band of enthusiastic volunteers have again freely given of their time to ensure that all the boys, girls, men and ladies can take part in the world game. As another year draws to a close it is great to be able to report the continuing progress that the club has made with its junior development program "The Hornets". As with all seasons we end with some teams finding great success and others disappointed that they did not have better fortune.

We should congratulate our merged Women's Premier League team's achieving Major Premiers status under the co-coaching arrangement of Tony Bruzzano and Roland Winter, this was despite the unsettling period where MWFA changes saw the removal of Premier League Reserve competition. Unfortunately in Men's Premier League we had our worst season for many years. Our great season last year meant that our players were coveted by other clubs and we struggled to replace the nucleus of last year's team we left and finished propping up the ladder. A special mention to the new Men's Over 35 Div 1 team, they finally made the move from AL2's and were rewarded with a top 4 finish and a Grand Final appearance. You will see elsewhere in this report the list of teams that achieved championships or grand finals. Congratulations to them all.

Again our thanks go to **Malouf Manly Pharmacy** who have been our major sponsor for the year. We really do appreciate their continuing support and hope you have all been to their friendly shop at 52 The Corso, Manly. The sponsorship agreement with **Seaforth Physiotherapy & Sports Injury Centre** has also developed well over the year. They provided physios to our PL teams and discounts on their services to all our members. This arrangement reflects the important value we place on the health and wellbeing of our members. This year the club purchased an Automated Emergency Defibrillator which was put out for all senior games. This was in conjunction with a MWFA project that I helped lead following the death on the pitch of my old team mate Ges D'Souza in Jan 2015.

The continuing of the Hornets junior development program was well managed by our Junior VP George Malouf, Coaching Director Tony Bruzzano and Scott White. Continuing to utilise a group of club sponsored coaches with additional coaching sessions aimed at up-skilling in the key development ages of 9-12. The program was again very well subscribed and the feedback really positive. We hoping to link in more development programs across different age groups next year.

We have again had our normal range of on and off field activities. Our committee has again shown a fantastic commitment to the club and the community. The committee members ensured that we were able to get our teams organised, registered, kitted out



and prepared to enjoy their games. Our grounds team made sure that the pitches were well prepared and the good summer weather and the underground watering system on David Thomas meant that the pitches were at their best state for many seasons. Special thanks to Caroline Hodges and our canteen team who again set the standard for all other clubs to try and follow and provided a huge portion of the clubs funding. The Manly Vale FC Facebook site continues to be a great method of getting information to our members along with the fantastic photos that Graeme Bolton posts from weekend games. So even away from playing days there is a great deal of time spent by our secretary, competition

secretary, registrar, MWFA delegates, sponsorship manager, and all the Vice Presidents. It was great to have and enthusiastic input from new committee member such as Jules Nickson-Pole (VP – Junior Girls), Steve Black (Treasurer) and Mel Turner (Working with Children Co-ordinator).

My thanks go to all of this year's committee, many of whom have now spent multiple years supporting the club. It has been especially good to see the ongoing success of our social activities, the Presentation events as well as our regular annual Trivia night.

REGISTRAR'S REPORT: *Peter Auld*

We had another successful season in terms of player numbers this year – 1,104 registered players, so a drop of 37 from the 2016 season. This was made up of:

This year, the numbers remained strong in all age categories, and Manly Vale continues to have more female players than any other club, and the highest proportion of female players at 43% of the total club numbers.

70% of players were returning from the 2016 season, with 30% being new players - a slightly higher ratio than last year (67% returning).

With the FFA online registration system in place again this year, we had 94% of players (91% in 2015, 94% in 2014, 88% in 2016) register online - it is a quick and convenient system which can save time for the players, and make it easier for the club to get all the registrations done in time for the start of the season.

We hope everyone enjoyed their year of football and we hope to see you back again next year.

As always the profit from the canteen goes towards the expenses required to keep the club running, this in turn helps to minimise registration fees to all players.

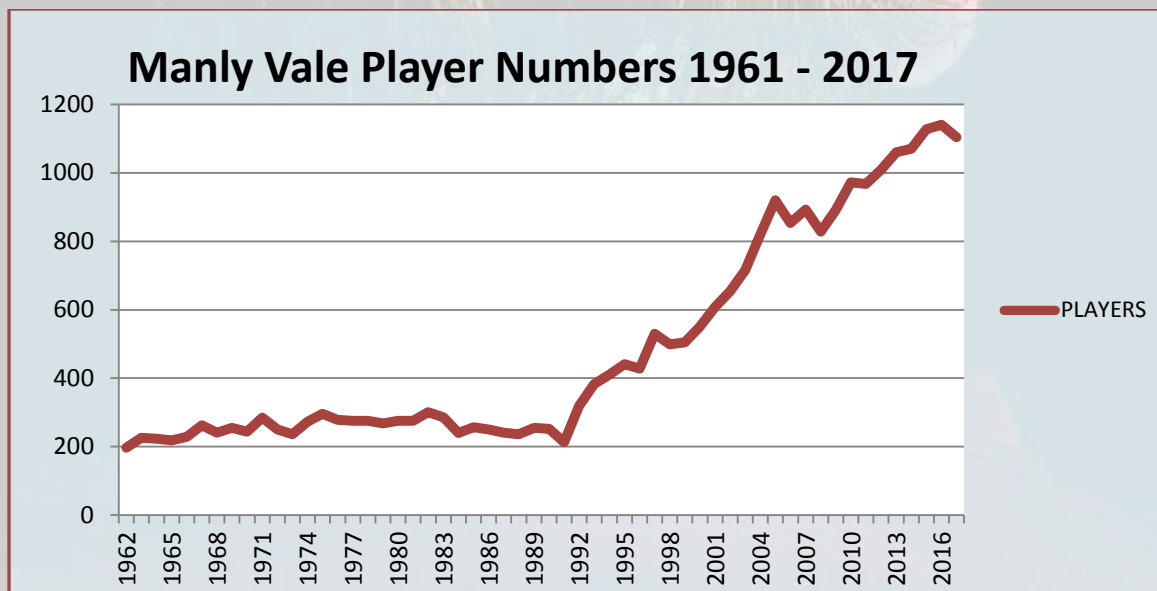
Extra Special thanks to:

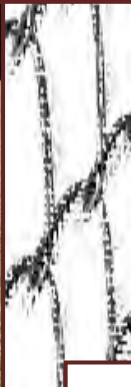
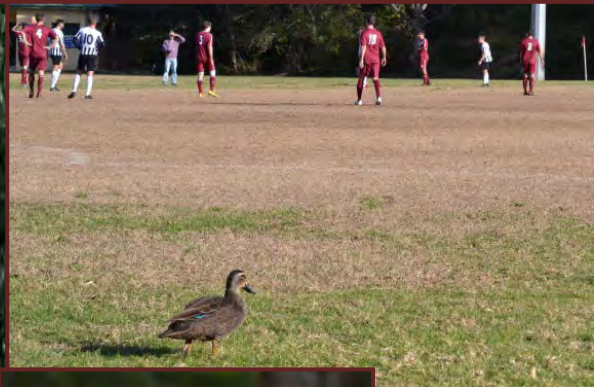

So, with 7 players returning, we gained 6 players from last season's U15's who didn't have enough players to make an U16 team, and Harry Ager returned to the club and they were all joined by 2 new recruits Chris Willscroft and Alex Butler. This meant close to half the squad were 15/16 years of age so a big step up to compete in the U18 competition.

Anyway, step up they did, the team went the season, played 16, lost only 1 game, won 11 and drew 4. Goals for 49, Goals against 18 (the best defensive record in the Division) Goal difference +31.

The team consistently played excellent football. Aaron Lambert again solid and impressive goalkeeping performances kept us in the contest. Our defence, in particular when playing the top teams and in the semi-final and Grand Final were outstanding. Led by our central defensive duo of Murray Wright and Peter Ng, our new young defensive additions grew in confidence week after week Jonty Malouf, Golf Saenthep and Mitch Nicholson really developing as players and also rarely showing their young age difference. Golf in particular providing the team with inspiration with his pre match prayer and also his off field entertainment and passion for the season.

Our midfield out played most opposition teams and entertained and provided many of the scoring opportunities for our strike force as well as contributing goals themselves (30 in total). Led by some outstanding performances from Dan Stern and Charlie Hales in the central midfield, Pat Mace holding and directing play from central defensive midfield and providing attacking outlets down the left and right were Chris, Harry and Jack and Alex & Dejan our all-rounders who was consistent in defence and dangerous attacking down the right and left.

It was especially pleasing that there were 10 different goal scorers this season, Charlie Hales topped the scoring with 11, Murray Wright 8 (1 pen in the grand final), Dan D'Elmaine 7, Dan Stern 6 (including the winner in the semi-final) Chris 6, Braden Brown 5, Jack Magee 3 (Jack the youngest player at only 15 years of age), Dejan Denton 2, Pat Mace 2 and Harry Ager 1. Our 2 main strikers Braden and Dan D'Elmaine worked tirelessly throughout the season often putting their bodies on the line and producing some incredible finishing and Murray also deserves a mention as often he was pushed forward from defence in the hope of finding a last minute goal or 2.

Some of the highlights of the season included clawing back from 3-1 down with just 2 minutes to go to draw 3-3 in the first game of the season v Manly Allambie, Braden scored to make it 3-2 in the 88th minute and Pat's injury time (93rd minute) freekick from just inside the oppositions half going straight into the roof of the net – their goalkeeper unable to get to the shot thru a six yard box packed with all 20 outfield players (which included Aaron our goalkeeper). Then again 3-2 down with 45 seconds left v BTH on the new astro turf at Forest Killarney, a thru ball to Murray who slotted calmly passed the keeper to equalise and one final amazing fight back, again the boys were playing Manly Allambie, they had already saved a draw from 3-1 down with 2 minutes to go in round 1, and round 12, at Nolans Reserve, saw the boys 2-0 down with just 15 minutes to go, oh and our stand in goalkeeper Dan D'Elmaine had just

made a miraculous second half save to avoid the team going 3-0 behind, and so again Murray was pushed forward with 15 minutes to go and on 75 minutes Murray immediately scored, slotting in past the keeper, then 3 minutes later he lobbed the keeper for his second and the score was 2-2, Murray was sent back into defence and 3 minutes later Braden lobbed the keeper



and we were 3-2 ahead and 3 minutes later Chris sealed the amazing comeback for a 4-2 win.

Then there were the 2 top of the table clashes with Narrabeen who we eventually lost 2-1 in the Grand Final. Both home and away games v Narrabeen, Manly Vale came out on top, the second game an outstanding performance from the team that some supporters described as the best Manly Vale team performance they had seen, goals from Braden, Chris and a bullet header from Charlie just before the end gave the boys a 3-1 victory and both games v St Augustines, always close, 1-1 in the first game with Harry skilfully weaving his way down the left before cutting in for Dan D'Elmaine to slot home the equaliser just 45 seconds into the second half and the return at Killarney Oval, an amazing equalising free kick from Dejan secured us the 1-1 draw.

The boys finished the season Division 3 runners up behind Narrabeen and above St Augustines and Harbord. The semi-final v St Augustines (2 v 3) was an extremely tense affair on a very windy and dusty David Thomas 2. A 25 yard strike from Dan Stern the difference and a 1-0 victory saw the boys through to the grand final v Narrabeen. The grand final was played on an amazing sunny morning and Cromer Park 3 was in good shape, the boys went behind midway through the first half and equalised with a 45th minute penalty drilled home by Murray. The second half was extremely close with both sides having chances and with just 15 minutes to go Narrabeen got the breakthrough and went on to win 2-1.

Once again a season full of very impressive personal and team performances a great effort boys and as always a pleasure to coach and watch the boys every week.
